Roseline Young, a recipient of the city of Fort Myers Individual Artist Grant 2016 and 2017 for providing noteworthy community art programs, will be featured in an exhibit at the Sidney and Berne Davis Art Center from Sept. 1-28.

A reception will be held during Art Walk on Friday, Sept. 1, from 6-10 p.m. at the center.

Young is an artist from New Orleans who retired to her 41-foot Morgan sailboat and settled in Cape Coral. She has always been interested in color and surface in art.

She taught art for 30 years, constantly finding ways to integrate art projects for the community: painting murals at libraries, hospitals, schools, creating hangings and installations for galleries, festivals and museums. She said she enjoys the interplay of threads, textures and colors in textile art and creates fabrics with paint, dye, silk screen, heavy texture, weaving and dense quilting.

Young's work has been featured in exhibits across the U.S., Great Britain, China and Australia. Her largest work was an installation at the New Orleans International Airport. Notable is an ornament for the White House, currently in the Smithsonian collection. In Louisiana, her work can be seen at the St. Bernard Public Library, New Orleans Juvenile Justice Building and private collections.

Florida Publix Supermarket is the recipient of six of her community paintings. The city of Fort Myers recently installed "Currents," a 60-foot by 6-foot artwork at the Stars Complex. She shares her expertise at conferences,
