#### Pim's Pelican Bay Thanksgiving Cruise



The Cayo Costa beaches are open, but nothing bay-side is accessible. Cayo Costa only has beach on Gulfside open and restrooms there are also open. Nothing else. No way to walk across island from Pelican Bay, no ranger station, no concessions, no bikes, kayaks, canoes, paddleboats, no cabins, no nothing.

Approximately six sailboats and eight or nine powerboats. The sand spit had two or three boats.

The Tunnel of Love was barely passable, but we made it. There were plenty of sawed off branches and way too many mangroves completely uprooted, making it difficult to navigate. Inside at the landing area are shelves of sand! Beachside has much debris, driftwood-type. Plenty of shells, but not many good ones. The elusive Junonia did not even yield

a shard!

No notable progress was observed on starting to rebuild the ferry dock. For these reasons, the anchorage and spit were less busy than usual. The manatee pocket probablywas the busiest

attraction. The southern beach at the Tunnel of Love was deserted the morning we were there.

We enjoyed Thanksgiving Dinner at Cabbage Key, continuing the tradition.

The mangroves around Cayo Costa seem to be rebounding noticeably better than those further south near the mouth of the river (St. James City to Punta Rassa).

The Manatee zone at Redfish Point and Cape "yacht club" is still unposted and ignored by many.
